These training institutions must provide programs combining higher-level math, science, computer, and design courses to train the design students for the design/drafting work place.

A senior candidate must be or have been involved in two activities during his/her freshman, sophomore, junior or senior years, only one of which may be athletic teams.

2. Select date and restaurant for the Senior Banquet; print tickets, select meal, entertainment, speaker, etc.
3. Create senior memory booklet
4. Organize activities for senior week (examples: upkeep of the "C" on Skyline Drive, painting Skyline Drive road, "Gotcha", swim party, etc.)
5. Decide on graduation gift from the class to the school
6. Senior Class President conducts tassel turn at graduation

Student Council, not to be confused with Student Government, is a democratic leadership activity in which the student body elect their representatives for their class. For the freshman class, four representatives are elected, the sophomore class has six, eight are elected for the junior class, and eight for the senior class. Head boy and Head girl are elected to head the student council. The Head boy and Head girl are elected in the Spring preceding their senior year. To be Head boy/girl, one must have previous experience in Student Council during their high school career. Anyone who meets that CHSAA eligibility can run for other positions in the council.
